Copeland began their presentation at 9:02 a.m.

Rob Knowles and Mark Giovanniello joined from Copeland.

Copeland added a new Associate Analyst; they have had no turnover in their investment team in 20 years. Firm AUM is just under \$9 billion, small cap about \$3.9 billion. Some new relationships have come on board. Russell selected them for another sub advised mandate in their multi manager ATF using their SMID cap strategy. Slightly behind the benchmark in 2Q25, Q325 has improved. Overall stock selection looks decent. Biggest head wins would be in the Tech industries and have had a lot of success in Healthcare. Small caps have lagged overall. Tariff concerns have faded, tough trailing year.

Aberdeen began their presentation at 9:31 a.m.

Christopher Colarik and Paul Mohr joined from Aberdeen.

Aberdeen promoted interim CEO Jason Whitlock to a permanent position as CEO last September. They are currently a 4 person team, but will be adding a 5th member soon, and will share updates at a later date. December 2024 through April 2025 has been difficult but appears to be getting back on track. Techla has been a fantastic resource. They are looking to invest in high quality, underappreciated companies with sustainable business models. They have had a great year and were in the top quartile, being driven by healthcare and industrials. They feel they are in a good position and will navigate the next several quarters with what is happening in Washington.

DAHAB began their presentation at 10:02 a.m.

Greg McNellie and Kevin Condy joined from DAHAB.

Spent time covering this performance in July, but felt largely everything is in line and relative to target and longer term perspectives. Where things aren't in line there are offsets. This quarter our return was 6.4% vs 1 year return which is at 10%. Out performance in the large cap space, which has been very strong. Loomis under performed in the quarter, but nothing to be concerned about. Overall happy with where we sit.
